Admission Policy

Introduction and Purpose

The purpose of introducing of this well-defined policy on admission is aimed at evolving a just and transparent mechanism for admissions at various levels of studies. Main elements of the policy are:

Merit:

Admissions will be granted strictly on merit subject to clearance of Entrance Test, personal Interview and in accordance with criteria and policy laid down by the statutory bodies. Candidates belonging to any area, class, caste, religion, and creed shall not be discriminated or discouraged from admission. Test would be conducted to ensure induction of students who possess personal interest, aptitude, abilities and having good moral character.

Admission Committee:

The Vice Chancellor/ PVC of respective campus (s) will constitute Admission Committees to be responsible to ensure that total admission process is managed and conducted in a right, just, transparent and professional manner.

Procedure:

To apply for admission, the student shall have the needed minimum qualification set forth for each program. In view of variation in schedules of examination conducted by various bodies in Pakistan and overseas. Applications for admission from students a waiting result shall also be entertained. Such applicants, if selected in the admission process, will be granted provisional admissions. These admissions will stand cancelled automatically if such candidates fail to attain the required minimum eligibility criteria.

Reserved Seats:

As per policy decision of Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PM&DC), ten percent (10%) of total seats allocated to the university would be reserved for overseas Pakistani students. Admission will be grated after proper verification of documents and proof of being an overseas Pakistani national

Public Announcement:

Admission office will announce opening of admissions through selected sources of public information system/ press/ Radio & TV/ Internet Websites.

University Admission Test:

Applicants for admission to all the Bachelor and Master degree programs will be required to take the Isra University Admission Test (IUAT). The admission would be purely on merit attained in this test. The test consists of two parts with an intermediate phase of short listing for personal interviews. Overseas Pakistani students will be exempted from taking the Isra University Admission Test. The selection of such students will exclusively be based on their academic record and interview.

Applicants for M. Phil, Ph.D or Postgraduate degree programs in clinical sciences, who fulfill the requisite conditions for admissions, will be called for a comprehensive interview or subject Graduate Records Examination or both. These students will not have to take Isra University Admission Test.

IUAT part-1:

This would be written test and Sample test papers available for each program of study, and will be provided to those candidates who complete the prescribed application form and register themselves for taking the admission test. The test would be conducted at the main campus and also at its other Campus at Karachi and Islamabad.

Short Listing of Candidates

Short listing will purely depend upon the scores achieved by students in Isra University Admission Test (IUAT part- 1). Only the short listed students will qualify for IUAT Part-2 and will be individually called for the interview.

IUAT Part-2

This part of test will be based on personal interview of the applicants to assess their communication skills, aptitude, integrity, motivation, maturity and interest in the selected degree program. Interviews will be held at respective Isra University Campus.

Selection for Admission:

The results of IUAT (both parts) will be compiled and reviewed by Isra University Admission Committee. The Committee will recommend students for admission. The decision of the Committee would be final and could not be challenged. Applicants who fail in IUAT could apply afresh in subsequent year(s). A fresh application would be must for admission in ensuring academic year. The merit of the applicant taking repeat test(s) will be evaluated on the basis of the best score in the current or previous test taken in the last two years.

Finalization of Admission Process

Admission to all the academic programs under all the categories, will remain incomplete and unconfirmed until the required documents are submitted and duly verified by the competent authority and required fees deposited in the bank through drafts or pay orders. NO cash transaction shall be entertained. Orders of competent authorities with regard to payment of amount of the fees, payment of taxes shall be applicable.

Orientation of Students:

All selected students would attend an orientation session arranged by the admission department of the university. Program Information Office (PIO) will arrange Orientation Program for new batches. Students will be provided detailed information about the subjects to be taken through a

course Catalog. Handbook for students will be provided to new comers, explaining academic calendar, assessment system, financial award, transport and other facilities available at the university.

Start of Classes

Academic classes for undergraduate students will start from 1st January of every year.
